## PROFILE OF MS. ARMIDA SALSIAH ALISJAHBANA

### **Professor of Economics, Faculty of Economics and Business, and Director, Center for Sustainable Development Goals Studies, Universitas Padjadjaran, Indonesia**

Professor Armida Salsiah Alisjahbana, S.E., M.A., Ph.D (born in Bandung, Indonesia), is Professor at the Faculty of Economics and Business, Director, Center for Sustainable Development Goals Studies, Universitas Padjadjaran, and Member Indonesian Academy of Sciences. She was Minister for National Development Planning / Head of BAPPENAS in the Second United Indonesia Cabinet (2009-2014) under the administration of President Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono. She served as Co-chair of the Global Partnership of Development Cooperation during 2012-2014 with fellow co-chairs Dr. Ngozi Okonjo Iweala, Minister of Finance, Nigeria and Ms. Justine Greening, Minister of Development Cooperation, UK. Professor Alisjahbana served as Alternate Governor of World Bank and ADB for Indonesia during 2009-2014. Recently, Professor Alisjahbana has been appointed as Member of the Independent Team of Advisors on SDGs to the UN ECOSOC.



At Universitas Padjadjaran, Prof. Alisjahbana has served various positions among others as Vice Dean for Academic Affairs, and Director of the Center for Economics and Development Studies (CEDS), both at the Faculty of Economics. She obtained her B.A. in Economics from University of Indonesia and earned an M.A. in Economics from Northwestern University, USA. She had her PhD in Economics from University of Washington, Seattle, USA. Before becoming Minister, in her academic capacity, Prof. Alisjahbana undertook various research tasks for the World Bank and the Australian Agency for International Development (AusAID). Her research interests have been in the area of economics of education, environmental and resource economics, labor economics, and public economics. Professor Alisjahbana has been involved in various research projects and as consultants to the United Nations University/Institute for Advanced Study in Tokyo, the World Bank, ADB, AusAID, the European Commission, and the International Labor Organization.

Prof. Alisjahbana holds International Advisory Board positions in the Bulletin of Indonesian Economic Studies (BIES) published by the Australian University, Canberra, and also President of Indonesia Regional Sciences Association (IRSA) (2009-2014). Her research works have been published in many economic journals and by a number of leading publishers.
