

WGEA Web enhancements—Phase II

Progress to date

Activities completed and update on future work

Web pages: Focus on waste and Focus on water. The prototypes of the web pages are complete.

Norway and the Netherlands will

- obtain the authorization from SAIs to publish papers and presentations (May 2006);
- adjust web pages according to steering committee comments (September-October 2006); and
- update the website twice a year (in May and November).

Greenlines newsletter. The second *Greenlines* newsletter was posted on the WGEA website in May 2006. (http://www.environmental-auditing.org/intosai/wgea.nsf/viewGreenlines) The third newsletter is due out in the fall of 2006. Fifth survey on environmental auditing. The fifth survey on environmental auditing consists of two forms: the survey form and the environmental audits collection form, which were sent to the SAI community in May 2006.

The survey contains questions on auditing mandate, environmental audits, environmental auditing capacity, internet capacity, co-operation between SAIs, and products developed by the WGEA. The collection form will enable the Secretariat to update the Environmental Audits Worldwide section of the WGEA website. SAIs had the option of filling out the survey form using the internet, email, diskette, or paper.

The Secretariat will finalize data entry for the survey in September 2006 and analyze the results. For more information, see the fifth survey progress report.

Greenlines notification. The Secretariat will look at possible options in having interested readers (SAIs) be automatically notified when a new publication of the Greenlines newsletter is released to the WGEA web site. However, work on *Greenlines* notification has been postponed until the Waste and Water pages are posted on the WGEA website and the fifth survey and audit collection forms have been sent to SAIs.
