

Pacific Regional Audit Initiative

- Public auditing challenges in the Pacific
 - Variable audit timeliness, quality and impact, lack of qualified staff
- PRAI objective
 - raise Pacific public auditing to uniformly high standards
 - increase capability for financial and performance auditing through cooperative audits
- 2 year development process, now in implementation phase
- Key partners PASAI, ADB, IDI, AusAid



PRAI - 4 main projects 2008-12

- Strengthened PASAI secretariat
- Financial audit capability sub-regional audit approach – Tuvalu, Kiribati, Nauru
- First cooperative performance audit
- Capacity building in each SAI



First cooperative performance audit

- 2008 PASAI congress agreed first cooperative performance audit should be on an environmental topic
- Links with WGEA work plan objective for cooperative performance audit in each region
- Survey of PASAI members on environmental/performance audit experience and preferred topic
- Suggested topics:
 - Solid waste
 - Fresh water
 - Fish stocks
 - Sanitation
 - Liquid fuel supply



Survey results

- 16 out of 20 SAIs in PASAI responded
- Mandate is not a problem
- Staff capability limited performance audit or environmental auditing experience
- But some experience in auditing environmental agencies or aid programs & some training courses attended
- Will be the first performance audit for many participants



Topic & eligibility

- Solid waste and fresh water were the two preferred topics.
- We chose solid waste as topic for 1st cooperative performance audit
- Water possible topic for 2nd cooperative performance audit.



Support for cooperative audit

- INTOSAI Development Initiative (IDI) to support planning and reporting meetings
 - IDI Program Manager Pritom Phookun to support audit
- ADB funded cooperative performance audit expert to provide support over duration of audit
 - ADB has engaged Claire Kelly, Senior Performance Auditor, Australian NAO in this role
- PASAI secretariat to provide administrative support for meetings
- RWGEA coordinator support audit & liaison with WGEA



Type of audit

- The audit will be a "coordinated audit" within WGEA guidance definition
- Cooperative audit team joint planning and reporting meetings
- Separate national reports
- Some form of joint report




PASAI congress Palau 20-24 July 2009

Towards Auditing Waste Management





Potential audit topics

- From the WGEA guidance
- 3 step process type of waste, waste stream, audit topic
- Solid waste
- Waste stream generation, collection, transport, disposal/treatment
- WGEA topics of most relevance:
 - Existence of policy/strategy
 - Compliance with policy/strategy (including attention to risk management
 - Monitoring/waste handling

Cooperative audit objective

To assess the effectiveness of management of solid waste in selected locations by auditing:

- The existence of a legal and policy framework for solid waste management
- The process by which the legal and policy framework is implemented, including whether risks to implementation have been considered
- Compliance with the legal and policy framework, including monitoring arrangements.



Expectations/commitment required

- Mandate
- Ideally 2 person team from each SAI one as lead
- Significant capacity building commitment team members need to be given time to fully participate in the audit
- Some performance audit experience if possible
- Attend planning meeting and reporting meeting
- Undertake field work late 2009-early 2010
- Publish a report in own jurisdiction
- Contribute to joint report for region

- Undertake further audits in area of waste management in own jurisdiction as appropriate
- Publishing country reports and joint regional report
